1. Executive Summary:

Major outcomes, results and impact of the Chair, including on national policies, in relation to its objectives as stated in Article 2 of the Chair Agreement (between the Institution and UNESCO)

In its first four years of operation (2018-2022) the activities of the **Lusófona UNESCO Chair "Education, Citizenship and Cultural Diversity" (LUC),** essentially aimed at fulfilling the commitments made in the application, creating the organizational bases, consolidating the team, expanding the partnerships (14 institutions including 2 UNESCO Chairs, in Brazil and in the USA) and initiating an ambitious research, teaching and university extension plan based on the reciprocity of knowledge and co-creation.

In partnership with the Department of Museology and the Center for Interdisciplinary Studies in Education and Development - CeiED, the chair continued to focus especially on high-quality postgraduate training at master's and doctoral levels, including the creation of 8 scholarships annually for the PhD in Museology, specialization training programs at the doctoral level (CEAMs) in Brazil and training workshops, devel\d in programs established with secondary schools.

LUC highlights the importance of some of our non-academic institutional partners. These partnerships allowed us to expand our activities with civil society organizations in specific areas of interest in the fields of Education and Museology. This have allowed for a more assertive action in favour of expanding the notion of citizenship and promoting actions that assume cultural diversity as a Human Right.

Some of our priority partners are: Instituto Paulo Freire - IPF Brazil, Latin American and the Caribbean Campaign in Defense of Paulo Freire's Legacy (CEAAL), Portal EducaMuseu and Portuguese Association of Culture and Permanent Education (APCEP) - Portugal, Association of Afro-descendant Memories (AFROLIS), Association of Afro-descendants (Djass), Association for the Development of Portuguese Gypsy Women (AMUCIP), Pantalassa Cultural Association, School groups in the Lisbon and Tagus Valley region, Maré Museum - Brazil, Museum of

Quilombos and Urban Favelas (Muquifu) - Brazil, Museums and House-Museums of the Municipality of Fundão - Portugal.

Academic, scientific and knowledge reciprocity activities - university extension - were based on the organization and maintenance of six postgraduate study groups. The six study groups were designed to carry out research on topics that broaden the notion of citizenship and diversity in the fields of Education and Culture and always in relation to civil society that is organized through NGOs, associations and institutions. These groups held a program of seminars open to different audiences throughout the period of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Several research projects were initiated and others were submitted for funding in partnership with universities and institutions in France, Italy, Spain, the Netherlands, Portugal, Belgium, Cyprus, Germany, North Macedonia, Brazil, Cuba, Colombia, Argentina, Peru, and Mexico.

In these four years of activity, we highlight that several research projects supported by LUC were approved by international funding agencies. We highlight that the Chairholder was recognized as a Principal Investigator in a 2019 international competition by the FCT (National Funding Agency for Science, Research and Technology) and the project "Generative bodies: from aggression to the insurgency. Contributions to a decolonial pedagogy" coordinated by Chairholder and by Mário Moutinho (LUC's Board) was funded by the FCT for the 2023-2026 period.

In addition to these Chairholder coordination projects, the LUC Chair supported the "Renova Museum Project" granted by the Ibero-American Museum Organization (IBERMUSEUMS); ECOHERITAGE Research Project (European Commission); COSMUS project (European Commission); Survey on Intangible Cultural Heritage in ASPnet Schools in the European Union (UNESCO and the European Union) and UNESCO Awareness-raising and guidance materials in Europe - these last two projects were coordinated by a professor from LUC's Board.

Summary : The AGGRIN project is aimed at contributing to the studies on racism from a decolonial perspective. It deals with discrimination and insurgency, through the study of the place that the bodies of racialized citizens occupy in these processes. We recognize that "non-bodies" in contexts of dominant whiteness, have always been the first "loci" of domination in power relations, in slave processes, in colonial and post-colonial processes, in patriarchal relations, in sexual domination and in the control of their subjectivities and knowledge. The project will focus its attention on one of the most common forms of racism, surreptitious aggression, named according to historical and cultural contexts of aversive racism, everyday racism or micro aggression. The project is part of the theoretical and social intervention framework of the Social Sciences, and is consistent with the SDGs 4, 5 and 16. The project is centred on the black and Afro-descendant population residing in Portugal, which is subject to multiple forms of racial discrimination, highlighted in the 2021- UN report, such as inequalities in the access to education, public services, employment, racial profiling in the justice system and police violence. In the last 5 years, this situation has worsened, calling for the renewal of studies on citizenship, education and cultural diversity from a perspective of Human Rights and cognitive justice.

The "Sociomuseology + Paulo Freire" Postgraduate Study Group is a collective of researchers from the UNESCO Chair "Education, Citizenship and Cultural Diversity" that has the support of the Museology Department of the Lusófona University of Humanities and Technologies and CeiED - Center for Studies in Education and Development and the FCT Project - Foundation for Science and Technology CEECIND/04717/2017. The Study Group includes researchers from the UNESCO Chair, CeiED and the Doctoral and Master's Programs in Museology at the Lusófona University of Humanities and Technology in Lisbon.

Open to the participation of the entire academic community of University Lusófona and the UNESCO Chair, the emphasis is on the members of the Research and Postgraduate Unit in Sociomuseology of the Center for Interdisciplinary Studies in Education and Development – CeiED. The group is also open to external participation, and aims to reach school teachers and professionals who work in non-formal education spaces, such as museums, scientific and cultural centers.

The meetings take place fortnightly and are promoted through Conversation Circles or Culture Cycles (according to Freire's terminology) conducted by guests (teachers, researchers and professionals in the areas of education, museology, culture and heritage) and, always having as a generating theme one of Paulo Freire's works or a Freire-inspired project in the field of Museology, Education and Heritage. The group organizes courses and seminars on the work, influence and resonances of Paulo Freire in the aforementioned areas that are open to the general public.

INTRODUCTION

The postgraduate study group MINA — "Insurgent Museologies in Our America" is a collective of the UNESCO Chair "Education, Citizenship and Cultural Diversity" that has the support of the Department of Museology of the ULHT and is part of the programs and R&D of CeiED - Center for Interdisciplinary Studies in Education and Development and the FCT Project - Foundation for Science and Technology CEECIND/04717/2017.

The MINA group was created in October 2021, with the objective of thinking, debating and practicing a museology with a social bias, from the Latin American perspective, having as object of study the criticism of museology transplanted to Latin American territories, by through historical processes of colonialism and, later, coloniality, which still determine a subservient behavior in relation to the production of knowledge with a strong Eurocentric bias. However, it mainly seeks to study and promote the sociomuseological processes that spread from Mexico to the south of Argentina and Chile, to stimulate intercultural dialogues between these processes and their agents, who think and act in a fertile soil of deliberately forgotten and forgotten memories or (un)consciously subordinated, racialized and oppressed.

MINA, therefore, makes an epistemic, theoretical, affective and political option of decolonial museology in its social dimension — of Tawantinsuyu, Anáhuac, Abya-Yala, Pindorama. To this end, it summons researchers and activists from the museological field interested in turning their gaze and thinking, from different socio-museological ideas and practices, around a communal heritage, victim of genocide and epistemicide, based on studies,



While the proposal for the exhibition arose on the occasion of the celebrations of the centenary of Paulo Freire's birth, the initiative was not just a one-off decision. The influence of the educator's thought and pedagogical praxis on the work of researchers linked to the ULHT's graduate program in Museology was already evident, a fact that became more evident with the creation of the study group Sociomuseology + Paulo Freire in 2019.

The question that guided LabSE in creating the exhibition was, "How can the expography be created from fundamental aspects of Freirean thought such as participation, dialogue, the use of available means and materials and critical debate?" Our answer to this question followed some guidelines: first, the action should have a physical presence and a virtual presence. Secondly, it would have to be thought of as an experimental activity, which would allow for deviations and correction of the path and bring the process of creation and conception as valuable in itself. In other words, for us, the process is more significant than the finished product, as we are teaching ourselves about Socioexpography. And in fact, with this website and the new developments that are being thought of, the exhibition can continue to grow and materialize in other products and other processes. Finally, the exhibition should involve the other study groups linked to the UNESCO-ULHT Chair.

• Carry out the V Course of Advanced Studies in Museology (CEAM) in Brazil with the partnership of Federal University of Rondônia (UNIR – Brazil), involving other institutions of the territory of the Amazon

• Promote, through Study Groups, Training courses and workshops in schools and associations
